The Public Bill Office of the House of Commons maintains a Public Bill Index from 1922 to the present day.

A weekly Information Bulletin showing the progress of all legislation, listing Committee meetings and providing other information relating to the business of the House is compiled by the Public Information Office of the House of Commons and published by The Stationery Office Limited.

Public and Private Bills and Delegated Legislation are also listed by session in the Part II Index to the relevant House of Commons Journal. A great deal of other procedural information can also be derived from this Index, for example the date of each stage in the passage of a particular Bill through the House of Commons, and instances of closure in the House and in Committees of the whole House. The Journal is published by The Stationery Office Limited.
